1907 - 1972

Pauline Wessell, was born at Beverly, Massachusetts on February 24, 1907. Her parents were George Washburn Wessell (a native of Danvers, Massachusetts) and Eugenie Marcia Flanders of Farmington, New Hampshire. Ethel graduated from the Danvers, Massachusetts, schools and did secretarial work before her marriage. She was a member of the Peabody Chapter #162 Order of the Eastern Star and served with a civil defense team during World War Two. She was baptized on February 28, 1943, by the Rev. Dr. Eric M. Tasman in The Church of The Holy Communion in South Orange, New Jersey. She was confirmed on March 21, 1943, by the Right Rev. Benjamin M. Washburn. Ethel served The Church of The Holy Communion for about 25 years as Church School Teacher and volunteer parish secretary for which a memorial United States flag was dedicated in her honor on December 3, 1972. Ethel had a very humorous disposition and was a good friend to people of all ages, but her greatest friends were little children. Stricken with cancer, Ethel died in the Allentown, Pennsylvania, hospital on April 12, 1972, and is buried at Allentown, Pennsylvania, in the Highland Memorial Park Cemetery, Laurel Sec, Loc C West, Grave #61-C.
